CENTRAL THEME OF THE SEMINAR

The Indian nationalist movement was a continuous process starting from small scale local resistance to an all India movement. In the years after the Great Uprising of 1857, it traversed from a 'policy of appearament' towards the British rulers to a movement of the people. During this period which spanned for almost ninety years from 1858 (Queen's Proclamation) to 1947 (achievement of Independence), the participants of the nationalist struggle followed variety of strategies, tactics and mode of involving masses of different strata against British rule. These may be classified into five broad categories:

- a) The Early Ideological Critique of the Colonial Rule: from Rammohun to Gokhale
- b) Strategy of legal-constitutional agitation
- c) Tribal and Peasant Rebellions (Primary and Secondary Resistance)
- d) Radical & Revolutionary activities
- e) Politics of Mass Mobilization
- 1. The nationalist criticism of the British rule was first initiated at the ideological- cultural level. The great personalities like Raja Rammohun Roy, Keshub Chandra Sen, Mahadev Govind Ranade, Akshay kumar Datta, Gopal Hari Deshmukh, Dadabhai Naoroji, R C Dutta, Gopalkrishna Gokhale and the likes started an ideological battle against the British colonial rule in India.
- 2. The legal & constitutional methods of putting demands on the colonial government were an important strategy of the Indian National Movement during its formative years and have been used repeatedly by the Moderates & the Home Rule League etc.
- 3.Starting from the second half of the eighteenth century to the whole of Nineteenth century, India witnessed a number of popular tribal and peasant movements: the Sansyasi & Fakir Rebellion (1762-1774); Peasant Rebellions of Sandip (1769), Dhalbhum (1769-1774), Rangpur (1783), Bishnupur (1789), Chuar (1799), Syhhlet (1799); Malabar Movement (1792); Santhal and Munda Rebellion (1855-1856 & 1899-1900); Great Uprising of 1857; Faraizi Movement (1818-1906); Wahhabi Movement (1818-1871) and the Indigo Rebellion (1859-1862). Up to 1870s, the movements were mainly 'primary' resistance in nature having a restorative aim whereas the later movements were basically 'secondary' forms of resistance. (Sumit Sarkar, 1983)

- 4. Beginning from the Swadeshi movement (1905) down to the Quit India Movement (1942), India had seen a number of mass upsurges though not continuously. Unlike his nationalist colleagues, Gandhi launched Satyagraha in remote areas instead of Presidency towns, e.g. Peasants Movements in Champaran in Bihar in 1917 & in Kheda in Gujarat in 1918 and Mill Workers Movements conducted in Ahmedabad in 1918. The Gandhian Strategy of Satyagraha radically altered the nature of the Indian national movement and mass involvement cutting across the caste, class or sex barrier.
- 5. The attack by Chapekar Brothers on Rand in Pune in 1897 may be treated as the first example of the Radical & Revolutionary activities which remained active mostly from 1904 to 1934. The organisations which played the most courageous role in the Radical & Revolutionary activities include the Marathi Revolutionaries, the Bengal Revolutionaries, mainly, the Anushilan Samiti & the Jugantar Federation, the Ghadar Revolutionaries, the HRA & the HSRA.
- 6. Some of the immortal but lesser known revolutionaries of Odisha whose struggles need be discussed and who might have found glorious places in the annals of Indian freedom movement have gone into oblivion unnoticed and unrecorded are Madho Singh and his sons, Basu Bisuni, Bal brothers, Jayee Rajaguru, Buxi Jagabandhu, Chakhi Khuntia, Sarala Devi, Samanta Madhaba Chandra Samantaray, Veer Surendra Sai, Baji Rout, Laxmi Panda, Ramadevi Chaudhury, Malati Choudhury, Raghu Dibakar and others.

Keeping in mind the above broad classificatory scheme, this Seminar proposes to concentrate on discourses on a number of related but lesser known aspects of Indian Nationalist Movement, particularly of Bengal and Odisha
