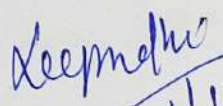

### What was the Role of IQAC for Academic Development during the period?

IQAC has taken a number of initiatives as mentioned below:

#### ▪ SKILL DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

As a part of in-house capacity building measure IQAC decided to provide an opportunity to the Teaching Staff and NTS to undergo a 'Comprehensive e-Learning to e-Training guide for Administrative Work', held from May 25 to June 5, 2020, organised by Ramanujan College, New Delhi, in collaboration with MHRD, GOI, and reimbursed the course fee of the successful participants by the college.

#### • INITIATION OF ACDEMIC EXCHANGE PROGRAMME:

As an Academic Development initiative, the IQAC had suggested a Proposal for Signing of MOU with Pallsey College, Pallsey, Nadia under Kalyani University for various Academic and Research exchange and Collaborations. Accordingly, MOU is signed between Principals of both the colleges for this purpose and due to pandemic Situation, only 3 Faculty Exchange Programmees were completed in the department of Bengali, Education and English.

#### ▪ WEBINARS ON PRESSING ISSUES DURING PANDEMIC:

IQAC also arranged for organizing various webinars during lockdown period in collaboration with various departments and external agencies on issues ranging from digital education, mental health of the students to women empowerment and creative writing. Some of the examples of such webinars are listed below:

1. **NATIONAL WEBINAR ON DIGITAL EDUCATION:** A National Webinar organized by IQAC, on 23 June 2020 in collaboration with Digital Edu Solution, Pune, titled Digital Transformation in Higher Education: Necessity & Change, to explore the avenues of implementing digital technology in the higher education field.
2. **NATIONAL WEBINAR BY ENGLISH DEPARTMENT:** Department of English, in collaboration with IQAC, organized a National Level webinar on the topic 'Coping with Corona: Literature as Antidote', on 9<sup>th</sup> July 2020 which focused on Biblio therapy as a combating strategy against pandemic related depression.
3. **NATIONAL WEBINAR BY STUDENTS' SUPPORT & PLACEMENT CELL:** A three-day National webinar by the IQAC & Student Support and Placement Cell, in collaboration with Skill to Hire, Hyderabad on the topic 'Skill Development' was organized from 17 to 19 July 2020. The webinar discussed the methodologies of developing skills of the students which can give them an extra edge in the job market.
4. **NATIONAL WEBINAR BY GEOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT:** Department of Geography, in collaboration with the IQAC, organized a national webinar on 22 July 2020 on the topic 'Institutional Methodology of Online Induction Program & the Issues related to it in Recent COVID 19 situation in India', to probe into the feasibility of conducting



Induction Program in online mode.

5. **NATIONAL WEBINAR BY CENTRAL LIBRARY:** A two-day National webinar by the IQAC & Central Library In collaboration with Skill-to-Hire, Hyderabad was held on 25 & 26 July 2020 on the topic 'Easy Implementation of LMS in the Institutions'. Students from all over the nation participated.

6. **NCC ORGANISES NATIONAL WEBINAR ON KARGIL VIJAY DIVAS:** Webinar On Kargil Vijay Divas was organized by the NCC unit of the college on 27<sup>th</sup> July 2020, to observe the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Indian Army's victory in the Kargil war and also to impart the spirit of patriotism among the young hearts.

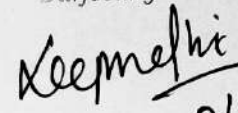
