



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<u>REPORT OF CONDUCTING PRACTICAL CLASSES USING VIRTUAL LAB</u> <u>SOFTWARE</u>




Experiential Learning is the process of applying theory and academic content to real-world experiences, whether in the classroom or in the community, in order to improve programme or course-based learning outcomes. This type of curriculum allows students to apply what they've learned in the classroom to real-life situations by working through complex, confusing real-world problems. With these goals in mind, Surya Sen Mahavidyala Geography students got some hands-on 'Experiential Learning' by examining the environmental conditions of local rivers including the Mahananda, Balason, Panchanoi, and others during the monsoonal month of 2021. From July 1 to 5, 2021, they have planned a short-term field excursion.



They visited certain sites in Siliguri and the surrounding area to identify the existing concerns related with the decrease of these rivers, such as the River Mahananda at Ward No-04, the Buri Balason River in Bagdogra, the River Chamta in Matigara, and the Fuleswari River in Siliguri. They interact with local residents who live in the riparian area, and they have held a focus group discussion with them about the issue. Their work was included in our yearly departmental E-Magazine, in Geographer's View Vol-01, Issue-01, as a "Nodi Churi" (Theft of River). A total of 19 Honours students from the 2nd, 4th, and 6th semesters actively participated in this programme,.

Report on the experiential learning adopted by the Department of English in the Academic year 2020-2021

The Department of English has been doing different academic activities from time to time to ensure active participation and experiential learning of the students. In the academic session 2020-2021 the department engaged students in various activities during which students were encouraged to take active part and gain first-hand knowledge from their experience of participation in such activities. Following is the brief report on different strategies adopted by the department:

1. Value Added Course on Business Ethics and Communication Strategies

30 hours Value Added course on the mentioned topic was organized by the department from 20th May 2021 to 31st May 2021 with an objective of involving the students to acquire knowledge on practical issues related to the topic. The course was offered online on the google meet platform pertaining to the ongoing covid 19 situation .53 students belonging to all three streams of the college (Arts, Science & Commerce) had participated and completed the course successfully. The course was designed to cover various issues related to the concept of business and the importance of effective communication skill. Various topics assigned to different teachers covered the conceptual shift of the term business and the responsibility of the conscious young mass in business. Another important objective of the course was to practically engage the learners to learn the nuances of effective communication in English, as it was learnt that maximum number of students coming from Hindi, Bengali and Nepali medium background of schooling had internalized the concept of communication in English as a barrier to effective learning.

To encourage the active participation of the students, various teaching- learning measures were applied in the form of discussion session after the class, individual assignment and final online assessment at the end of the course. Feedback forms for frank opinions from the students on the course were collected at the end.

2. Group presentation by students

Group presentation for 6th semester was organized by Prof. Nimu Rai and Prof. Puja Mahajan on 18th June, 22nd June and 23rd June, 2021 respectively on Google Meet platform. The topic for the presentation on 18th June was from Modern European Drama, Postcolonial Literature and Indian English Literature belonging to the syllabus. For the presentation students were divided into different groups consisting of one group leader each and four to five group members and they were given various sub topics for presentation. Prof. Puja Mahajan was invited as an observer to moderate the session on 18th June. Similar pattern was followed for the presentation on 22nd and 23rd June 2021 and the topic of presentation was from Partition Literature and Postcolonial Literature. Prof. Nimu Rai and Dr. Sanchita Das were invited to monitor the session on 22^{nd} and 23^{rd} June respectively. At the end of the presentation a question answer session was conducted by the respective observers in which students participated actively.

3. Future Smile: A Career Guidance undertaking amidst Covid 19

A session on the above-mentioned topic was organized by Prof. Sutapa Saha and Dr. Arnab Baul on 13th July, 2021 to discuss about different job prospects after the completion of graduation. Students from 3rd, 5th and 6th semester of the English Department had participated in the session. Prof. Saha discussed about the new concept of employment and different job avenues that covid 19 situation had generated. Dr. Baul talked about the job prospect in academics and methods of preparation for such jobs. During the session Students came up with different doubts and questions and the teachers tried to answer their queries. In the session the students were encouraged to present their opinions on various academic doubts as well as ideas as well.


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
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
Report on Departmental Workshop on Softwares in Chemistry


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
Report on Experiential Learning


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
